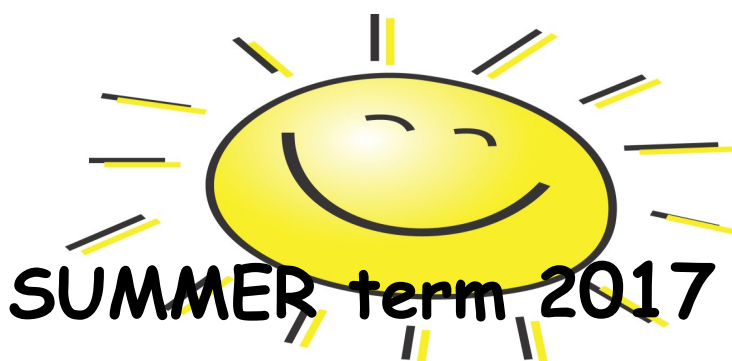

Order forms were sent home on Tuesday, this week.

Hertfordshire Road Safety Partnership has asked that we use our newsletter to highlight the change in the law for using your mobile phone whilst driving.

The new penalties now mean that motorists and motorcyclists caught using a phone while driving and riding (stopped at traffic lights or queuing in traffic) will receive six penalty points and £200 fine. It is also illegal to use a hand-held mobile when supervising a learner driver or rider.

'Keep safe—put your phone away in the glove compartment'

We have also been advised that some of our parents are not fastening their children into seatbelts while driving. This, again, is against the law and a very dangerous lack of attention to the safety of the children in the car.
