CELTIC HARMONY (Hertford) - Friday 8th March 2024

Cost per child = £25 The children will have the unique opportunity to experience life in the Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age. They will get to make Stone Age tools and Bronze Age beaker pots, along with experiencing what life was like in round house buildings. The children will be given the opportunity to trade and role play using real Stone-Age artefacts as farmers, hunters, miners etc and exchange goods of different values using numeracy skills. READING FLUENCY PROJECT

A group of children from 6K, 6O'B and 5T took part in the Reading Fluency Project last term, which is run by Herts for Learning. The results of progress were astounding, with all children making at least one year's progress in their comprehension! In a couple of cases, children in year 6 made three and even four years progress. We are really proud of the children and hope that this encourages them to read more and enjoy books. We also hope that the children use the strategies of text marking and reading for prosody in order to help aid them with their comprehension.
